



ENGLAND & FRANCE

MARCH 18 - APRIL 1, 2015 14 DAYS

Explore two of Europe's grandest cities, London and Paris, in addition to the surrounding English and French countryside.

B - breakfast, D - dinner

MARCH 18 . . .

Depart from Indiana in the afternoon/evening.

MARCH 19 . . .

Arrive in London. After checking in our hotel we go out and explore this beautiful city starting with the hub of it all-- Westminster Abbey, Parliament Square, Big Ben, the London Eye, Whitehall, and Trafalgar Square. Group welcome dinner in the evening. Stay in London for 6 nights. D

MARCH 20 . . .

We visit the Buckingham Palace for the Changing of the Guard, then continue on to the British Museum, probably the world's most important historical museum, and then the British Library. B, D

MARCH 21 • • •

Take a day trip to visit Stonehenge and Windsor Castle. B, D

MARCH 22 . . .

Visit the fascinating Churchill War Museum to learn more about WWII and what transpired in Europe during that tumultuous time. We also see the National Gallery's art collection. B

MARCH 23 . . .

Visit The Tower of London and St. Paul's Cathedral, then cross the the Millenium Bridge to Shakespeare's Globe Theatre and the Tate Modern art museum. B

MARCH 24 * * *

Transfer to Paris and settle into our hotel. Take an introductory walk on the Ile de Cite including Notre Dame church, Sainte Chapelle, and end with a boat ride on the Seine. Stay in Paris for 4 nights. B, D

MARCH 25 . . .

Visit the Arc de Triomphe monument in the morning then walk down the famous Champs Flysees Boulevard to Paris' most famous museum, the Louvre. Afterwards we visit St. Jacques deaf school, the historic place where Clerc, Sicard, and Massieu came from . B, D

MARCH 26 . . .

Take the train to Versailles to visit the beautiful chateau and gardens that was the home of the French government during Louis 15th's long, prosperous rule. B

MARCH 27 • • •

Visit the Paris Catacombs in the morning. Afterwards, go to the Eiffel Tower, the most recognizable building in Paris, and the Invalides for Napoleon's tomb and the excellent military museum. B, D

MARCH 28 • • •

We drive from Paris to Rouen in the morning and visit the famous Saint Joan of Arc church. Next we go to Caen to visit the Memorial Museum to learn more about the history of World War II. Continue on to Bayeux. Sleep in Bayeux for 3 nights. B, D

MARCH 29 • • •

Today we focus on the D-Day sights: Starting with the museum in Arromanches, followed by the Longues-sur-Mer gun battery, Normandy American Cemetery, Pointe du Hoc Ranger Monument, and Omaha Beach itself. B, D

MARCH 30 • • •

Take a day trip to visit Mont St. Michel, probably France's most popular sight. Spend a half day here to explore the interesting history of the island. Return to Bayeux in the afternoon.

MARCH 31 . . .

Visit the world famous Bayeux Tapestry in the morning then drive back to Paris and take a driving tour around Paris. Farewell dinner and transfer to our hotel near the airport. Sleep in Roissy-en-France for 1 night. B, D

APRIL 1 . . .

Transfer to Charles de Gaulle airport for your flight back to the USA. B
